1.10 BRIEF SUMMARIES OF THE STUDY AREAS PURSUED IN THE COUNTRIES VISITED

Legal theory vs legal practice- what makes a good law? When conflicts arise, how to citizens and parliamentarians balance rights with responsibilities.

Legislation & policy- unintended consequences- interpreting the law for organisations, public and private. Who decides what unclear laws mean? Who is responsible when laws are interpreted in ways that conflict with other laws and duties?

Sex based rights- their erosion and suppression, and avenues for their re-instatement.

Child safeguarding- Why have child time-tested, common-sense safeguards been removed? Why are children described in government documents and curriculums as erotically sexual beings? How can we rebuild the sensible centre on social policy.

Prisoner rights- single sex prison facilities are a human rights issue. Nelson Mandela principles etc. Research issues and legal language. Advocating for the most vulnerable cohorts.

Parental rights- Tracking the removal and undermining of parental rights and standing in the community and in childcare and education settings. A conflict of interest. Legal principles to challenge. Coalition building and community education.

Democracy- the importance of freedom of conscience, association and speech- why do some organisations get a free pass and others do not?

Energy and cost of living- nuclear energy as the clean, cheap, and reliable answer to cheap, abundant energy- from Europe.
