
Together we give every Victorian the best learning and development experience, making our state a smarter, fairer and more prosperous place



#### School Education – Improving Student Outcomes

**2021 preliminary NAPLAN** results indicate Victorian students are leading the country in attaining the National Minimum Standards (NMS) other than in Year 9 Writing, where Victoria is marginally second.



#### School Education – Improving Student Outcomes

Despite year-on-year fluctuations, there is a consistent trend of improvement in preliminary Victorian NAPLAN results between 2015 and 2021, particularly among high achievers in the primary school years.


Increases in the proportion of students in the top two bands in all year levels for Reading since 2015 indicate that student performance has lifted in recent years.

#### Training And Skills – Building The Workforce We Need



Free TAFE for Priority Courses giving Victorians the skills to work on government major projects and priorities, including:

- major infrastructure projects
- responding to family violence
- NDIS
- mental health
- aged care
- three-year-old kinder.

Investment in better facilities is changing training:

- opened Box Hill Institute's Lilydale Campus Integrated Centre for Sustainable Construction Technologies.
- construction began on the GOTAFE Seymour Health and Services Training Facility, the Gordon Culinary School in Geelong, and the South West TAFE Warrnambool Campus Learning and Library Hub
