
4.2% regional unemployment (April 2019), the lowest of any state (down from 6.6% in November 2014)



- A **new Regional HQ** will be established in Ballarat
- GovHubs are bringing more public sector jobs to regional Victoria
- Better coordination of whole-of-state regional priorities, e.g.
 - Access to specialist health services
 - Housing to tackle homelessness and support victims of family violence

- Improve public transport, country roads, TAFE facilities, and provide critical health facility upgrades






2019-20 Victorian Budget \$134 million Regional Development Priorities initiative

Delivers a range of priority initiatives across Victoria, including -

- Renewed Regional Jobs and Infrastructure Fund
- Key election commitments, including:
 - Regional Car Parks Fund
 - Sebastopol revitalisation
 - Benalla Splash Park
 - Lake Entrance Fisherman's Co-op on-water café development
- Other asset and output initiatives:
 - o A bigger, better Eureka sports precinct for Ballarat
 - o Daylesford and Macedon Ranges festivals and events
 - Bringing the best sports and entertainment to Geelong



2019-20 Victorian Budget Extension of the Regional Jobs and Infrastructure Fund

- Regional Development Priorities initiative includes funding to renew the Regional Jobs and Infrastructure Fund (RJIF)
- Grants-based funding available to support projects that create new jobs
- Grants available to co-invest in local infrastructure that facilitates private sector investment or improves business activity centres
- Over the past 4 years RJIF has supported more than 700 projects valued at \$1.72 billion – creating or retaining more than 8,570 jobs





Regional Partnerships

- Important role bringing regional priorities to the heart of government
- More than 2000 community members attended Regional Assemblies across Victoria in 2018
- Outcomes Roadmaps produced by Regional Partnerships will guide efforts of government
- Future Regional Assemblies will be focussed, issue-specific forums
