




Child Protection Budget Output Growth

 In 2019-20, \$1.5 billion will be invested in Child Protection services – excluding the impact of the transfer of activities to Family Violence Service Delivery, this represents a 6.7 per cent annual increase.




Roadmap for Reform: Strong Families, Safe Children

- Roadmap for Reform launched in April 2016
- Shifts focus from crisis response to earlier intervention and prevention
- Trialling evidence-based models of care
- Key investment of \$858.6 million in 2018/19 in Children & Families sector



Child Protection recruitment

 Over the past four financial years, the Andrews Labor Government has funded more than 650 new Full Time Equivalent (FTE) Child Protection Practitioner positions



Child Protection overview

The Andrews Labor Government's 2019-20 Budget is investing an additional **\$260.6 million in Child Protection services, programs and agencies** to protect the wellbeing of vulnerable children and their families.


This includes:

- **\$116.1 million** to continue the Kinship Care Model
- **\$41.8 million** to provide additional support for children in care
- **\$36.6 million** to progress the government's reform agenda, focusing on early intervention and diversion
- **\$30.0 million** to provide additional child protection workforce capacity
- **\$16.2 million** for the Commission for Children and Young People to administer the Reportable Conduct Scheme and Child Safe Standards

Over the past five budgets, the Andrews Labor Government has invested an additional \$2.5 billion in Child Protection services.
