
Victoria's economic recovery

Victoria has returned to an operating cash surplus

The four-step fiscal strategy

- 1 creating jobs, reducing unemployment and restoring economic growth
- 2 returning to an operating cash surplus
 - **3** returning to operating surpluses
 - 4 stabilising debt levels

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\$12 billion for Victoria's health system to support pandemic recovery

COVID Catch-Up

• **\$1.5 billion** to increase surgical activity beyond pre-pandemic levels

Supporting our health workers

• \$124m to get more paramedics on the road

Aged care in regional areas

• **\$146m** to build three new aged care facilities

\$2.9 billion in health infrastructure, including:

- \$900m for the new Melton Hospital
- \$500m for the Barwon Women's and Children's Hospital

Increasing Triple Zero capacity

 \$333m to add nearly 400 new staff for call taking and dispatch capacity



\$2.4 billion for more emergency staff to support new wards as they open and **\$4.2 billion** for our ongoing pandemic response.

Creating decent, secure jobs

The Government is on track to reach the Job's Plan target of 400,000 jobs by 2025.

Sick Pay Guarantee

 \$246m for piloting to support casual and insecure workers in selected industries who do not otherwise receive sick or carer's pay

Wage theft laws

 \$6m to continue the operations of Wage Inspectorate Victoria to fight wage theft in Victoria

The budget builds on **more than \$13b** in COVID-19 related support provided to businesses since March 2020.

Building a world-class education system

\$1.8 billion investment in building schools and upgrades for schools where our kids don't just learn, they excel

New schools and upgrades

- **\$581m** to build **13 new schools**, and funding to complete additional stages at four schools
- \$560m to upgrade 65 schools including
 \$326m for 36 special schools

Excellence in education

• **\$69m** to expand the **Head Start** apprenticeships and traineeships program

Early years investment

• \$131m to continue four-year-old kindergarten services



Total investment in improving and building new schools is more than \$12.8 billion

Made in Victoria

Building Victoria's future by investing in Victorian jobs and industry

Supporting Victorian industry

• **\$120m Victorian Industry Fund** prioritises areas of strategic importance to Victoria's recovery, generating new investment and jobs

Skilling Victorians

• **\$83m** to support and strengthen **TAFEs** as they transition to a new funding model

This budget invests **\$20m to support trade** and identify opportunities for Victorian businesses as borders reopen across the world.

Commonwealth Games: Victoria 2026

\$2.6 billion investment to bring the 2026 Commonwealth Games to Victoria's regions

Four regional hubs to be established in:

- Geelong
- Bendigo
- Ballarat
- Gippsland

Tourists – and their dollars – will be welcomed across regional Victoria with:

- Shepparton confirmed to host events and other venues currently under consideration
- Other regional towns and cities are able to register their interest in hosting activities as part of the Games

Getting Victorians home sooner and safer



Better, safer roads

- **\$780m** in 2022/23 on maintenance works for metropolitan and regional roads
- \$213m for the Mickleham Road 1.6km road upgrade
- **\$126m** in metropolitan road upgrades
- **\$101m** in regional road upgrades

Improving public transport

\$265m for new and upgraded trains and trams
\$250m for 12 new VLocity trains



By 2025, **85 dangerous and congested level crossings will be removed,** with 68 to be removed by the end of 2022

Significant reform and investment to promote equality, tackle disadvantage and improve fairness

Victoria's First Peoples

• **\$151m** for Victoria's treaty process

Tailored homelessness support

• **\$75m** to provide tailored homelessness support, including focusing on early intervention and sustainable housing

\$504m for early intervention initiatives including:

 Expansion of the Navigator program, helping an additional 1,400 severely disengaged young people to reconnect with learning

Helping families

\$513m for services that support vulnerable children and family violence victim survivors

\$272m to support for vulnerable children, including

- \$85m for residential care and to continue the Care Hub program
- **\$58m** to support up to 1,000 additional vulnerable families

\$241m for ending family violence, including:

- **\$69m** to continue funding for family violence refuges
- **\$43m** for family violence services



The Government has invested **\$2.9b to protect children and help keep vulnerable families together** since the 2019/20 Budget.

Building strong communities

Investments in a range of initiatives to support and strengthen Victorian communities

Community sport and parks

• **\$88m** to meet demand for local sport and active recreation infrastructure

A fair go for people with a disability

• **\$15m** investment in the State Disability Plan


Emergency response
