The Youth portfolio:

Gives young people a platform to inform government policy and the delivery of programs and services

> Supports young people to actively participate in the social, economic and civic life of our state

Delivers initiatives that engage young people in their local communities, connect them to their peers and build their skills



Building on our achievements in 2021-22



Expanded the Engage! and FReeZA programs by providing funding to almost **200** organisations which will give almost **200,000** young people opportunities to build their practical skills, work on community projects, increase their economic participation and deliver community events.



Six Community Support Groups supported at-risk young people, their families and communities through **6,630** case management plans including referrals to community services and other supports.



Eight Scout Hall upgrades completed as part of the Government's \$5.5 million commitment for Scouting infrastructure, with Scouts Victoria and Girl Guides Victoria supporting over **21,200** young people to participate in programs in 2021.



The Living Learning Partnership Addressing Disadvantage supported its first cohort of **48** young people aged 15 – 21 with a mental health condition to re-engage in education.



Investment through the 2022-23 Victorian Budget

Youth portfolio initiatives announced in the 2022-23 State Budget include:

- > \$1.8 million to continue early intervention supports for vulnerable young people and improve young people's access to Scouts and Girl Guides.
- > **\$0.6 million** to support the youth sector to strengthen Aboriginal young people's right to self-determination.
