Key achievements over the last 12 months

In 2021-22, we continued to partner with Victoria's multicultural communities to strengthen services and create social and economic opportunities.

Highlights:

- > Pandemic support for **1.5 million** Victorians including emergency relief, targeted outreach and communications including vaccine information.
- > Funded **30** organisations to upgrade and build multicultural community facilities.
- > Supported **500+** face-to-face, digital or hybrid festivals and events.
- > **850+** multicultural seniors organisations funded.
- Legal support for 2,500 people seeking asylum and 2,300 Afghan community members.
- Supported 1,500+ students and families from African backgrounds, along with 300+ jobseekers of African heritage to gain training, certification, and employment opportunities.
- Worked with the Anti-Racism Taskforce to run a consultation to inform Victoria's first Anti-Racism Strategy

Dedicated COVID-19 supports in 2021-22

In 2021-22, **\$21.7 million** was allocated to the CALD Communities Taskforce to support multicultural communities impacted by the pandemic.

- > To date, this funding has delivered:
 - » over 500 projects with 340 community organisations across 73 LGAs
 - » support for **176,000** families and households.
 - » \$8.45 million for the Priority Response to Multicultural Communities grants program
 - » **\$6.8 million** for communications and engagement initiatives including:
 - **\$5 million** across two rounds of the Multicultural Communications
 Outreach Program
 - Continuation of the National Ethnic and Multicultural Broadcasters' Council's Multilingual News Service broadcast in **19 languages** on ethnic community radio and online
 - » \$6.4 million to support vaccine uptake among multicultural communities across 12 LGAs



Funding overview

Multicultural Affairs initiatives announced in the 2022-23 Budget total **\$22.7 million** and include:

- > \$6.7 million to continue critical settlement support services for Priority Newly Arrived Migrant Communities
- > \$6.4 million for continuation of the Multicultural Community Infrastructure Fund
- > \$4.4 million for continued delivery of Victorian African Communities Action Plan initiatives
- > \$3.7 million to continue COVID-19 support for multicultural communities
- > \$1.1 million for the Multicultural Festivals and Events program
- > \$0.3 million for Language Services Procurement Reforms

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
