2022-23 Budget overview

This year's Budget investment of

\$217.2 million




builds on the significant investment and reforms of recent years to:

- help maintain universal access to 15 hours of funded four-year-old kindergarten
- support the delivery of the landmark Three-Year-Old Kindergarten reform
- ensure vulnerable children are strongly supported
- improve outcomes for culturally and linguistically diverse children
- continue the successful Early Childhood Language Program
- make kindergarten services more inclusive through building upgrades



Investing in the early years – recent Budget investment



Three-Year-Old Kindergarten

The Budget supports ongoing record investment in Three-Year-Old Kindergarten

- Almost \$5 billion decade-long reform will mean 2 years of funded 15 hour-a-week kindergarten programs for all Victorian threeand four-year-olds by 2029
- This year, children across the state have access to at least 5 hours of funded Three-Year-Old Kindergarten at about 2,700 services
- More than 2,800 teacher scholarships have been awarded

- 5,842 commencements in Free TAFE Early Childhood Education and Care Diploma and Certificate III since 2020 – 59% increase in 2021 as compared to 2019
- By 2029 about 90,000 children each year will benefit from this reform
- A \$14.7 million investment will extend popular Kinder Kits to boost children's learning through play at home



Maintaining Universal Access To Kindergarten Services

Investment of

\$131.2 million



to maintain universal access to kindergarten and deliver 15 hours of 4-year-old kindergarten including:

- **\$63.7 million** supporting services to maintain staff/child ratios
- **\$55.2 million** to implement the Preschool Reform Agreement, including working with the sector on better understanding the attendance of children at services
- **\$4.3 million** to 100 rural kindergartens to deliver Four-Year-Old Kindergarten
- **\$6.7 million** to supplement the cost of employing more than 2,400 experienced teachers a year
- **\$1.4 million** to meet demand for Kindergarten Fee Subsidy so all eligible children can access free or low-cost services



Tailored support for vulnerable and disadvantaged children

\$20.9 million



for early interventions and supports for vulnerable children taking part in early childhood education, including:



\$13.6 million to continue the Early Childhood LOOKOUT Program to support children in out of home care



\$4.2 million to continue the Access to Early **Learning Program**



\$2.2 million to expand the Kindergarten Fee Subsidy for all children known to child protection or from a refugee or asylum seeker background



Improving outcomes for culturally and linguistically diverse children

\$4 million



to provide outreach support for children from culturally and linguistically diverse families to boost participation.

\$5.5 million

to continue our early childhood language program – 17 languages in 161 kinders for 6,000 children



Supporting young children with disability

\$16.9 million



to improve outcomes for children with disability or complex medical needs by meeting the demand for the Kindergarten Inclusion Support program



to help kindergarten services provide more inclusive facilities as part of the successful Building Blocks Inclusion grants program

\$5.1 million



to ensure children with disability who are not eligible for National Disability Insurance Scheme due to their residency status can access early childhood intervention services



more than \$259 million in 159 capacity-building projects




more than \$35 million in 375 improvement projects
