




Prison demand has **decreased** over the past two years.

#### **Budget in 2022-23**

A total of \$165 million was provided for initiatives in the Corrections portfolio, including:



#### Reducing reoffending

- Initiatives to reduce reoffending and support people in prison, including:
  - rehabilitation and reintegration support
  - o disability supports
  - o family programs
  - employment and mentoring opportunities
  - Improved oversight of people on CCOs.



### Support for ageing people in prison

- \$2.5 million to deliver supports to the ageing prison population:
  - o personal care services
  - aged care consult service and specialist aged care transition service.



#### Youth Forensic Mental Health Service

- \$1.5 million to plan and design a youth forensic mental health service in correctional centres.
- The service will cater to young people aged between 18 and 25.

#### **Budget in 2022-23**

A total of \$165 million was provided for initiatives in the Corrections portfolio, including:



### Western Plains Correctional Centre

- \$39.5 million to secure and maintain the Western Plains Correctional Centre and prepare for operationalisation.
- Construction of the Centre is on track to be completed in the second half of 2022.



### Responding to COVID-19

- \$54.3 million for costs incurred in 2021-22 responding to COVID-19 in prisons. Includes measures to:
  - prevent and control
     COVID-19 transmission in custodial facilities
  - mitigate the impacts of COVID-19 restrictions on prisoners.



#### Maribyrnong Community Residential Facility

 \$21 million to continue providing short term accommodation and transitional support for men exiting the prison system at the Maribyrnong Community Residential Facility.

### Reducing reoffending

The corrections system plays a critical role in reducing reoffending.

The 2021-22 expected outcome for the rate of return to prison within two years is **37.7 per cent**; 5.9 points lower than the 2020-21 result (43.6 per cent) and a better result than targeted (41 per cent).

The 2022-23 Budget allocated \$75.4 million for initiatives to reduce reoffending and support people in prison. Key initiatives include:

- \$3.6 million to support the Women and Mentoring program.
- \$21.1 million for rehabilitation and reintegration support for sentenced prisoners
- \$8.3 million to continue the Prison Disability Support Initiative to support the rehabilitation of prisoners with disability and their transition back into the community
- \$3.4 million to expand the **Family Visits Program** to men's prisons which encourages repairing relationships and assists with reunification of family units
- \$7.7 million for **employment hubs** at minimum and medium security facilities to support people at all stages of the employment journey
- \$1.4 million for **improved oversight** of people on Community Corrections Orders.





# Keeping the system safe

The prison and community corrections systems have **continued to manage COVID-19 safely**, with the health and wellbeing of staff and offenders at the core of the approach. This includes:

- Rolling out an on-site custodial COVID-19 vaccination program for staff and people in prison
- Providing additional wellbeing support for people in quarantine
- Enhanced use of IT for visits
