The past year saw agriculture further highlighted as a central pillar of Victoria's economy and vital part of our regional communities.

Our achievements – Agriculture

Seasonal Workforce: Transitioning from COVID-19 response to sustainability

Supporting a vital workforce during peak harvest

- Through the Seasonal Sign-on Bonus, 3,883 local workers signed up for seasonal farm work, leading to nearly 120,000 days worth of labour
- We facilitated the entry and quarantine of over 2,470 pacific workers to fill needed roles in Victorian horticulture and meat processing businesses
- The Seasonal Workforce Program has transitioned to focus on strengthening workforce capacity, building accommodation, creating new traineeships – responding to the needs of industry

Our achievements – Agriculture

Diversification of Victoria's agricultural exports

\$5 million Pathways to Export program has helped connect farmers with international markets

- Vietnam +69%
- The Philippines +103%
- Belgium +340%
- Sri Lanka +135%

Legislative reform

- New animal welfare legislation: Work is progressing on the development of draft legislation for a new Act to replace the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act
- Animal Activism Bill: The Livestock Management Amendment (Animal Activism) Bill 2021 was passed by Parliament, protecting the health and welfare of animals on farms
- Reuniting Pets Bill: We passed legislation in February 2022 that will assist vets and animal shelters to reunite lost pets with their owners more efficiently
- Agriculture Legislation Amendment Bill: currently before the Victorian Parliament

Our achievements – Agriculture

Accelerating Victoria's agriculture sector response to a changing climate

- Agriculture Sector Pledge \$19.9 million over 4 years to support the agriculture sector to respond to climate change and reduce its emissions
- Achievements -
 - flagship trials in pasture-based grazing systems
 - development of interactive online spatial tool
 - on-farm action plan pilot to deliver up to 250 farm action plans
- Climate Change Adaptation Action Plans, including the Primary Production Adaptation Action Plan 2022-2026 covering agriculture, plantation forestry, productive fisheries.
- Victorian Agricultural and Climate Change Council, has held 5 regional and 1 statewide roundtable with farmers and industry.

Our achievements

Delivering the Victorian Forestry Plan

\$200 million to support workers, businesses and communities through their transition away from the native timber industry ahead of commercial timber harvesting ending in 2030.

Achievements

- Forestry Business Transition Voucher Program: Assisted timber industry businesses, with Round One fully subscribed and 41 vouchers issued.
- \$25 million Timber Innovation Fund: Provided \$2.5 million in business grants.
- Local Development Strategy grants: Grants approved for eight out of eleven affected communities to develop local plans for transition.
- Gippsland Plantation Investment Program: Commercial negotiations are underway for the expansion

Game – supporting sustainable hunting

- \$5.3 million Sustainable Hunting Action Plan Released in December 2021 with a new set of actions to support sustainable, safe and responsible hunting.
- Kangaroo Harvesting Program has enabled the sustainable, commercial harvesting of kangaroos in Victoria.

We are strengthening out communities to build resilience to future threats to Victorian agriculture industries

A collective biosecurity movement

- **\$1.8 million** to work with community and industry in delivering a collective biosecurity program, focussing on shared responsibility to support community-led action to manage pests.
- Joint emergency exercise training with industry and the promotion of surveillance and voluntary compliance through the development of a biosecurity citizen science toolkit

Climate Ready Agriculture

- \$1.4 million for co-investment in the extension of the Regional Drought Resilience Planning Program
- Drought Resilience Plans to identify and guide innovative actions that will build resilience to future droughts.

This budget – key Agriculture initiatives

We are continuing our ongoing commitment to better animal welfare, ensuring we keep protecting the animals in our lives

Animal care and protection

- \$1.8 million to support the continued development of the Animal Care and Protection Bill to replace the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 1986
- *Every Pet Counts*: Victoria's first ever comprehensive pet census, providing an opportunity to better understand a fundamental shift in community attitudes regarding pet ownership
- **\$1.3 million** to develop a Victorian cat management strategy, including education campaigns and grant support to encourage cat containment and responsible cat ownership
- Support for animals and owners in need funding for animal care organisations
- \$11.5 million for the new state-of-the-art, purpose-built Ballarat Animal Shelter
- Taskforce on Rehoming Pets' \$2.7 million to implement the 17 recommendations of the final report

This budget – key Forestry initiatives

Strengthening the Victorian Forestry Plan (VFP)

As announced in late 2019, government is strengthening the VFP with an additional \$119.7 million, bringing the total support package to over \$200 million for the life of the VFP through to 2031-32.

The new funding will support 2022-23 initiatives to support affected businesses, communities and workers including:

- an Opt-out Scheme to enable a limited number of mills to exit the native timber industry in 2023
- a \$22 million Community Transition and Development Fund to support outcomes of the Local Development Strategies
- additional funding for round 2 of the Forestry Business Transition Voucher program
- \$20 million added to the Victorian Timber Innovation Fund to support business transition
- increases to the **Worker Support Package**, including worker redundancy top-ups, relocation payments and mental health and wellbeing support
