Investing in the health and well-being of casual and contract workers

Sick Pay Guarantee (SPG)

- The SPG continues to provide sick and carer's pay for casual and contract workers:
 - More than 66,000 Victorians have signed up since its launch in March 2022.
 - 121,000 claims have been approved nearly 180,000 days of sick pay.
 - 92% of claims were approved within 5 business days.
- Impacts of the SPG (based on survey responses):
 - Most common reason workers claim SPG is for common contagious illnesses (colds and flu).
 - 41% said that receiving sick pay enabled them to choose to stay at home.
 - 100% said the SPG helped them to recover more quickly than if they had gone to work.
 - 93% felt they would be less productive had they attended work.

Investing in our future workforce skills

Major Projects Skills Guarantee (MPSG)

- The MPSG provides opportunities for apprentices, trainees and cadets to work on Victoria's largest construction projects.
- Since its introduction in 2016, the MPSG has been applied to **400 projects**, which have committed to **21.4 million** contracted hours for **6,212** apprentices, trainees and cadets.
- This includes commitments to employ 810 apprentices, trainees and cadets across
 104 regional projects.
- MPSG projects under delivery in the 2021-22 financial year supported opportunities for **1,976** apprentices, **1,090** trainees, and **966** cadets.

Providing targeted supports to Victorian workers and communities

Local Employment Transition Service

• Since July 2017, **11,700** workers have been supported through industry transition, including over **3,900** since July 2021.

Social Enterprise

 The Victorian social enterprise sector has created over 12,000 jobs for people with disability, and over 4,000 jobs for long-term unemployed people.

Aboriginal Economic Development

- The Victorian Government is supporting the implementation of the Yuma Yirramboi Strategy.
 - Self-determined economic development priorities are being developed by 11 Traditional Owner Corporations.
 - Cultural hubs are being set up throughout the regions ahead of the 2026 Commonwealth Games.

Supporting Victorians into work

Jobs Victoria

- Since Jobs Victoria was established in October 2016, it has placed more than **64,000** people into a job, including more than **54,000** since mid-2020.
- At least 25,500 have maintained that employment for over 26 weeks.
- Other outcomes include:
 - The Jobs Victoria Fund has delivered more than 10,000 secure jobs in priority sectors experiencing workforce shortages, such as social services and manufacturing.
 - The Fund has delivered against its targets of over 60% of jobs for women and 25% of jobs for women over 45.
 - Over 1,300 Aboriginal Victorians have been placed in work through Jobs Victoria services since 2021.

Key employment initiatives in the 2023-24 Budget

- Jobs Victoria: \$35.1 million over 2 years to deliver Jobs Victoria Mentor services and support for Ready Set.
 - Jobs Victoria Mentors provide personalised support to those Victorian jobseekers who are hardest to place, in areas experiencing entrenched disadvantage.
 - Funding for Ready Set delivers on an election commitment to provide \$100,000 to support jobseekers struggling to enter the workforce by providing clothing and coaching services.
