OUTDOOR RECREATION PORTFOLIO

Victorians are heavily involved in outdoor recreation

- Around 1 million recreational fishers, creating over 27,000 jobs
- 620 commercial fishing licences, annual economic value of \$62.3 million
- 120 aquaculture licences, annual economic value of \$59.7 million
- 222,012 registered boating vessels
- **446,946** recreational boating licence holders
- 26,662 direct and indirect jobs across Victoria



Helping Victorians to spend more time outdoors

Since 2018, we have:

- Built a new native fish hatchery at Arcadia
- Invested over \$40 million removing industrial netting from Port Phillip Bay and the Gippsland Lakes
- **Provided over 600 tonne** of Snapper, Whiting, Flathead
- **Stocked nearly 10 million fish annually** throughout Victoria's rivers and waterways
- Made all Victorian boat ramps free to launch and park
- Upgraded boating facilities across Victoria
- Developed a Traditional Owner Game Management Strategy

The 2023-24 Budget builds on our record investment across the portfolio, delivering on all our election commitments BUDGET INITIATIVES

Responsible game management and better access to waterways

We are investing:

- \$26.5 million over four years to improve access to waterways including:
 - **\$22.1 million** to deliver 15 ramps, jetties and car parks across Victoria
 - **\$4.4 million** to deliver upgrades at Tarago Reservoir, opening it up to motorised boats and recreational fishing
- \$2.3 million to continue the work of the Game Management Authority



BUDGET INITIATIVES

Growing our fishing and aquaculture sector

We are investing \$32 million over four years to grow recreational fishing in Victoria and grow Victoria's aquaculture sector including:

- **\$10.0 million** to triple the size of the native fish hatchery at Arcadia
- **\$5.0 million** to build new facilities at the Snobs Creek Fish Hatchery
- **\$10.0 million** to keep our fish stocking at national record levels
- **\$1.5 million** to grow fishing participation in school aged children through a Little Anglers initiative
- \$5.25 million for grants to recreational fishing and aquaculture, including \$1 million for Aquaculture Jobs Fund and \$0.250 million for Oyster Farm in Lakes Entrance.

We will also continue to support the Women in Recreational Fishing and Boating (WIRFAB) network.
