In the latest round 23 per cent of voucher recipients identified that they had not previously been involved in a sport. That number has tracked down over the six rounds, which is telling us that people are coming back. They have got faith in the system, and they are coming back and getting a voucher in subsequent rounds. But we are still holding steady at 50 per cent of participants saying that they would not be able to participate without the program. That has held steady over six rounds, so we know that it is getting to the people that need it most. So that has remained a really critical, important stat for us.

**Danny O'BRIEN**: Just on the data you are going to provide, Minister, can you give it by year as well? I assume it will be broken down.

Ros SPENCE: By round.

**Danny O'BRIEN**: By round – that will do. Thank you. Sorry, Ellen.
