- Financial harms
- Health aspects
- Relationship breakdown
- Work and study harm

PATHWAYS BETWEEN GAMBLING HARM AND THE JUSTICE SYSTEM

(Campbell et all 2017)

- To repay the accumulated financial debt
- Vietnamese women prisoners has increased by 481% since 2000




REASON OF GAMBLING HARM IN VICTORIAN VIETNAMESE

- High level of shame
- Not seeking external help
- 'Loss of face'
- Problem reflects on the family as a whole
- Little experience or knowledge of counselling process

- Clinical practices
- Resources within Vietnamese community in Victoria



PEER SUPPORT

ACTIVATOR OF CHANGES (AOC)

- All women participants
- empowered to contact support services
- referred to various services

GAMBLER ANOMYNOUS - AVWA

Online social support group, cofacilitated by the Footscray Narcotics Anonymous facilitator and AVWA's Gambling Counsellor

Culturally appropriate outcome measures and evaluation models

- conducted in Vietnamese and translated by Lirata's Vietnamese-speaking Associate.
- AVWA provided culturally appropriate based on participants' needs and building trust among the community





Gambling Counselling


- culturally sensitive and linguistically appropriate counselling
- mostly reaches out to gamblers with severe gambling harms and correctional relating issues



Gambling Prevention

- helps community and groups to understand the barriers to participation for Vietnamese women
- effectively refer participants to relevant services for support
