## Challenges we faced during 2022-23

# Responding to the October 2022 flood emergency

- Forest Fire Management Victoria (FFMVic) crews completed more than 15,000 shifts
- Agriculture Victoria coordinated over 28,000 calls to farmers impacted by flood in late 2022 and early 2023 to provide urgent animal welfare and technical support to farmers
- Completion of works to mitigate critical and immediate risks to aquatic threatened species
- Cleared and re-opened roads, parks and other visitor sites, including the rebuild of the Lower Snowy Campground in Gippsland

# Bushfire response and recovery

- Responded to 838 fires across
   Victoria that impacted 4,299
   hectares of land
- Deployed crews to support firefighters in Canada and the Kimberley region
- Supported the delivery of 20
   Traditional Owner burns and conducted 76 of 160 identified priority burns

# Other emergencies and actions

 Assisted with other emergencies including blue green algae responses, whale and dolphin emergencies and supporting the New South Wales Varroa Mite Response

## Challenges we faced during 2021-22

## Bushfire response and recovery and other actions

- Cleared and reopened 459 kilometres of bushfire-impacted public land roads, with a total of 8,979 kilometres reopened since the 2019-20 bushfire season
- Since the 2019-20 bushfire season to 30 June 2022, nearly one million hectares of herbivore, predator and weed control was delivered through the Bushfire Biodiversity Response and Recovery Program
- During 2021-22, FFMVic crews responded to 1,066 fires impacting 12,588 hectares of public and private land
- Supported wildlife with 430 hectares of pest animal control, 60 nest boxes and a trial of carved hollows for over 30 species reliant on hollows for breeding and nesting

# Responding to the June and October 2021 storm and flood events


- Worked with essential services to restore power to 300,000 homes and 520,000 businesses
- Rolled out two relief packages including the prolonged power outage payments and small generator loan program
- FFMVic crews cleared more than 6,600 kilometres of public land roads and reopened 2,854 kilometres of the strategic fire access network
- Reinstated 88 bridges and crossings, 210 recreation sites and 167 walking tracks
- Repaired 23 damaged water monitoring gauges and supported Catchment Management Authorities in Gippsland to stabilise waterways and stream banks at over 177 sites and the Thomson River Fishway
- Ag Vic provided Clean-up and Restoration Grants through DRFA of up to \$25,000 to primary producers impacted by this event.

# Net zero emission, climate-ready economy and community

 Set a new 2035 target to reduce Victoria's greenhouse gas emissions by 75-80 per cent below 2005 levels and brought forward the date to achieve net zero emissions from 2050 to 2045

# Reliable, sustainable and affordable energy services

- Third round of the Power Saving Bonus Program received more than 1.84 million applications, totalling more than \$460 million in payments to Victorian households
- The first 35 public electric vehicle chargers funded under the Destination Charging Across Victoria program were completed in May 2023
- Progressed the neighbourhood batteries initiative to lead to the rollout 100 Neighbourhood Batteries
- Almost 500,000 households and businesses participated in the Victorian Energy Upgrades program
- Approx 70,000 rebates and loans were provided for solar panels,
   battery storage and energy efficient hot water systems

## Achieving our outcomes in 2022-23

#### Healthy, resilient and biodiverse environment

- Provided grants under the Regional Recycling Fund of up to \$500,000 to help upgrade infrastructure for recyclable materials including cardboard, plastic, paper, glass and mixed recyclables
- Concluded the Bushfire Biodiversity Response and Recovery Program, delivering
   1.5 million hectares of herbivore, predator and weed control to benefit more than 4,400 native flora and fauna
- Supported wildlife shelters and foster carers to rehabilitate and release injured and orphaned wildlife with over \$1 million provided
- Under the BushBank Program, secured a delivery partner to revegetate and restore native vegetation across at least 20,000 hectares of land

### Productive and effective land management

- Acquired 391 hectares of land for the Three New Parks project and 84 hectares of former landfill for the Sandbelt Parklands project
- Completed delivery of 20 pocket parks, 13 off-leash dog parks, five trails and 36 parks revitalisation projects under the **Suburban parks** program
- Awarded more than \$582,000 to 67 community-led projects through the Coastcare Victoria Community Grants Program

## Achieving our outcomes in 2022-23

#### Safe and sustainable water resources

- Launched Water is Life: Traditional Owner Access to Water Roadmap to support pathway to genuine, meaningful outcomes for and in partnership with Traditional Owners
- Launched the Central and Gippsland Region Sustainable Water Strategy
- Secured funding for future flood mitigation activities following the October 2022 flood emergency
- Improved access to recreational opportunities on and around waterbased natural spaces with all-abilities equipment, new shelters, BBQs

# Reduced impact of major bushfires and other emergencies on people, property and the environment

- 2,155 kilometres of road upgrades and 10 large crossings/bridges replacements delivered across Victoria's strategic fire access road network
- Delivered 28 **ecological burns** covering 11,802 hectares, to promote beneficial outcomes in vegetation that requires fire for regeneration

## Promote productive and sustainably used natural resources

- Reforms introduced to enable vets and registered animal shelters to directly reunite lost dogs and cats with their owners
- Provided leadership to the Victorian Government Emergency Animal Disease (EAD) Preparedness Program
- Supported programs to assist Victoria's native timber industry to align with the cessation of commercial harvesting by 1 January 2024
- Critical mine rehabilitation policy and works progressed in 2022-23 to keep local communities safe
- A draft Code of Practice for Common Risk Management Techniques for Quarries was completed in June 2023

# Net zero emission, climate-ready economy and community

- Released Victoria's Climate Change Adaptation Action Plans
- Released Regional Adaptation Strategies
- Worked with local councils across Victoria to achieve 21 voluntary council emissions reduction pledges being made

#### Healthy, resilient and biodiverse environment

- Introduced the Circular Economy (Waste Reduction and Recycling) Bill 2021 into Parliament in October 2021
- Phased out certain single-use plastic items across the Victorian public service from February 2022
- Released 18 Helmeted Honeyeaters into the Yarra Ranges
   National Park in May 2022, marking a major milestone for the
   critically endangered species
- Delivered Biodiversity Community programs with almost 1,000 grants and contracts totalling \$17.4 million to support the volunteering community in delivering on-ground action

# Reliable, sustainable and affordable energy services

- Received more than 400,000 applications through the Power Saving Bonus program with nearly \$100 million in payments to vulnerable Victorian households
- The Victorian Big Battery completed its first summer of safeguarding the state's energy supply
- Provided \$37.9 million in funding to support the initial development of three offshore wind projects
- More than 5,000 zero emission vehicles purchased with support from the Zero Emission Vehicle program
- Provided 70,000 rebates and loans for solar panels, battery storage and solar hot water systems

# Reduced impact of major bushfires and other emergencies on people, property and the environment

- More than 78,000 hectares of land was treated using planned burns and mechanical treatments
- Responded to **58 non-fire emergency** events, including cetacean, wildlife, search and rescue and blue green algae events
- Worked in partnership with 10 Traditional Owner Corporations for implementing cultural fire

### Productive and effective land management

- Completed remediation works at five contaminated land sites
- · Released the Marine and Coastal Strategy
- Supported Traditional Owners in developing the Victorian Traditional Owner Cultural Landscapes Strategy
- Released the Yellingbo (Liwik Barring) Landscape Conservation
   Area 10-year Plan to enhance its beauty, biodiversity, cultural
   heritage and community enjoyment



### Achieving our outcomes in 2021-22

#### Safe and sustainable water resources

- Supported water returns of 1.36 GL to Traditional Owners in Northern Victoria and 2.5 GL to Gunditj Mirring Traditional Owner Aboriginal Corporation
- Released: Burndap Birrarung burndap umarkoo (Yarra Strategic Plan); Waterways of the West and Rivers of the Barwon (Barre Warre Yulluk) Action Plans
- Assisted more than 1,300 vulnerable and hardship households and more than 200 non-for-profit organisations' in saving over 77 ML of water per year, through the community rebate/retrofit programs

# Promote productive and sustainably used natural resources

- Commenced the On-Farm Action Plan Pilot to support 250 farm businesses to measure and implement actions to reduce emissions
- Supported farmers to reduce energy costs and be more energy efficient and productive through the Agriculture Energy Investment Plan
- Supported more than 1,000 workers to enter the horticulture industry through the Seasonal Harvest Sign-On Bonus Program and facilitated the arrival of 1,630 Pacific workers
- Facilitated new minerals exploration investment in Victoria, with a quarterly record of \$64.1 million minerals exploration expenditure in December 2021
- Delivered new petroleum regulations to govern the onshore conventional gas sector
- Introduced the Sustainable Forests Timber Amendment (Timber Harvesting Safety Zones) Bill 2022 to Parliament
