The Jobs Plan, our plan for Victorian jobs and Victorian workers





- \$1 billion for training and skills to give Victorians the skills to get back to work, including providing up to 80 000 new training places over four years.
- \$836 million for the New Jobs Tax Credit for businesses who rehire staff, to restore hours and create new jobs to stimulate the economy.
- \$619 million for Jobs for Victoria to provide targeted and tailored support for Victorians who are unemployed. This includes:
 - ✓ \$250 million for wage subsidies with at least \$150 million for getting women back into ongoing, permanent work.
- ✓ \$5 million to develop a Secure Work Pilot Scheme. Once in place, this two-year pilot will provide up to five days of sick and carers pay at the national minimum age for casual or insecure workers in priority industries.




- \$250 million for tutors to bring students up to speed. The initiative will recruit more than 4 100 tutors across government and non-government schools for post-pandemic support, with around 80 per cent expected to be filled by women.
- \$235 million for the Recovery Workforce to support 500 new jobs across the mental health, family violence, health and child protection sectors.
- ✓ \$170 million to make kinder free next year.
- ✓ \$82 million to increase outside hours school care availability, to encourage more women back into work.
- \$17 million to continue to promote gender equality in Victoria by advancing implementation of Victoria's Gender Equality Strategy – Safe and Strong – which will promote Victorian women's participation and leadership in the workforce.
- ✓ \$5 million for the Women in Construction Strategy.
- \$2.3 million for the Women in Transport Program to deliver training, scholarship and employment opportunities.

- ✓ \$6 billion for the Big Housing Build including \$5.3 billion to construct more than 12,000 new social and affordable homes, creating 10,000 jobs on average each year for four years.
- \$2.2 billion for the Suburban Rail Loop to transform Victoria's public transport system and connect Melbourne's middle suburbs.
- \$2.0 billion for Geelong Fast Rail to build faster, more frequent and more reliable services to Geelong, supporting our state's busiest regional rail.
- \$1.9 billion school building blitz, with 162 school upgrades and more new schools, bringing total investment to \$3 billion since the pandemic began.
- ✓ \$1.6 billion investment to improve energy efficiency in Victorian homes and accelerate clean energy initiatives.
- \$1.4 billion for Phase One of the Melbourne Arts Precincts Transformation to attract visitors from interstate and overseas, creating thousands of local jobs and giving families a new public place to enjoy and explore.



- \$2 billion Breakthrough Victoria Fund to drive investment in research, innovation and the next great breakthrough – focusing on health and life-sciences, agri-food, advanced manufacturing, clean energy and digital technologies.
- \$626 million for Victoria's Digital Future Now to eradicate mobile blackspots in populated areas and funding for business-grade broadband in suburbs and regional towns.
- ✓ \$210 million to support the research and growth of our medical research organisations and institutes, including the Australian Institute for Infectious Disease.
- \$120 million to strengthen advanced manufacturing capabilities and to support local industries including agrifood and digital technology.

- \$465 million to restart Victoria's regional visitor economy and to support thousands of jobs in local economies, including \$28 million to provide Victorian Regional Travel Vouchers to kickstart regional tourism and to encourage Victorian to explore their own backyard.
- ✓ **\$156 million for the Regional Jobs and Infrastructure Fund** to back local priorities.
- \$75 million to extend and expand the Growing Suburbs Fund to support our suburbs and invest in our communities.
- ✓ \$65 million landmark agriculture strategy to lay the foundations for a more innovative and sustainable agriculture sector.
- \$63 million towards the School and Community Safety Program to improve traffic flow, new walking paths and safety upgrades around Victorian schools.
