### The 2020-21 Budget – Key Initiatives

We are building on the success of Jobs Victoria and Working for Victoria to support unemployed Victorians during this economic downturn

- A \$250 million job subsidy fund to support the creation of around 10,000 jobs
- This includes at least **\$150 million** extra funding to create jobs for women
- A **\$266.5 million** investment to treble Jobs Victoria deliver face-to-face advice and support to those who need extra help.

# The 2020-21 Budget – Key Initiatives

We're bolstering employment services across the board, to ensure we support Victorian jobseekers to find their next opportunity – no matter what it is

- JobsBank will receive a \$15 million investment to strengthen its focus on inclusive employment and leveraging the social procurement framework.
- We're also investing **\$64 million** in the **Innovation and Digital Jobs Program**, which will reskill unemployed workers to transition into digital careers by providing high-quality training, paid digital internships and digital studentship places.

# The 2020-21 Budget – Key Initiatives

We're bolstering employment services across the board, to ensure we support Victorian jobseekers to find their next opportunity – no matter what it is

- We've also committed \$8.8 million to focus on local initiatives like the Local Jobs Champions, who work in areas of high unemployment with flexible funding to unlock local job opportunities and pathways.
- **\$10.9 million** will support a **flexible pathways fund** to address the specific needs of jobseekers, such as additional personal support.

## Supporting jobseekers into work throughout the pandemic

- We have provided key support to Victorians during the pandemic
  - The \$587.5 million Working for Victoria initiative has helped people who have lost their jobs to find paid work that supports the Victorian community
  - It has created more than 11,000 new jobs for Victorians in quick pandemic-response short term roles and longer-term jobs supporting local communities – 3,500 additional candidates have been matched into jobs without funding support.
  - Targeted support for young people, via the Youth Employment Program and the Victorian Apprenticeships Recovery package which are helping young people gain traineeships, apprenticeships and other roles in the public and private sectors
- We are continuing to support long-term jobseekers who face employment barriers:
  - Jobs Victoria has supported 13,900 jobseekers into work since October 2016
  - This includes more than 3,900 young people connected to jobs
