
## **YOUTH PORTFOLIO**

## THIS BUDGET DELIVERS WHEN YOUNG PEOPLE NEED IT MOST

The 2020-21 Victorian Budget provides an additional \$11.5 million to continue successful initiatives that are engaging and supporting young people at a time when they need it most

- > Continuation of Community Support Groups for South Sudanese young people and families in Wyndham, Melton/Brimbank and Dandenong/Casey, as well as Community Support Groups for Muslim young people in West Heidelberg, Dandenong, south east Melbourne and Melbourne's west.
- > Continuing the Le Mana Pasifika Project for vulnerable Pasifika young people support through schools, community programs and individual casework.
- > Continuing the Regional Presence Project through Youth Affairs Council Victoria (YACVic) and Centre for Multicultural Youth (CMY) offices in Warrnambool, Morwell, Ballarat and Swan Hill.
- > Continuing the Latrobe Youth Space in Morwell to deliver programs which support youth employment, re-engagement with education and connection with the local community for young people across the Latrobe Valley.
- Funding for five Aboriginal organisations to develop and deliver bespoke community-led mentoring programs for young Aboriginal Victorians – strengthening connection to culture and pathways into training and employment.





## **KEY ACHIEVEMENTS THIS YEAR** Listening to and acting on the needs of young people

- > Launched an online state-wide consultation process to inform the development of a new whole of government youth strategy.
- > Established the new Victorian Youth Congress (youth advisory group with 21 representatives from across the state) which is partnering with government to co-design and deliver the youth strategy consultation.
- > Convened a series of virtual roundtables with young people and a range of sector experts on the mental health and employment impacts of the coronavirus (COVID-19) on young people.
- > Community Support Groups and Le Mana Pasifika Project supported young people and families during the pandemic, including supplying laptops and internet devices to support online learning and emergency relief for families in self-isolation.
- > Announced funding for a further eight Scout Hall projects as part of the Government's
  \$5.5 million election commitment for Scouting infrastructure.
