

Total prison receptions and discharges trend




Over 2019-20, prison population fell 12%

Safe and secure prisons during COVID-19

Quick adaption of the prison system to ensure COVID safe delivery, including:



Budget in 2020-21 [A]



\$103.6 million

To support the **response to COVID-19** in the adult custodial and youth justice systems. This investment will help continue to operate a strong and safe corrections system.



\$21.2 million

To ensure prisoners have access to quality **VET education programs**



\$6.7 million

For critical **capital upgrades** at the **Emu Creek facility**

Budget in 2020-21 [B]



\$4.8 million

To support increased access to **clinical assessments** for prisoners with **disability**, who are over-represented in the corrections system; as well as people in the Youth Justice system



For tailored **women's psychological trauma counselling**

Rehabilitation of offenders

Rehabilitation and reintegration programs are critical to enhancing community safety and reducing reoffending.

Prisoners have a complex range of health issues, including higher levels of mental illness, substance use and chronic and communicable diseases.

Over \$550 million has been committed to programs and services to reduce reoffending since 2015-16.

The prison system provides a range of treatment options to help address substance use problems. These services are targeted at rehabilitation and reducing recidivism.

Services include:



Drug and alcohol programs



Counselling and mental health support



Education and training



Disability support







Reintegration Services

The State-wide Indigenous Arts in Prisons and Community (SIAPC)

This program, delivered by the Torch, assists rehabilitation by generating opportunities to reconnect with culture, foster new networks and pursue educational and vocational avenues upon release for emerging Aboriginal artists.

The Torch employ in-prison and post release Indigenous Arts Officers who provide cultural and artistic support to participants across all Victorian prisons. An annual exhibition, Confined, gives participants a change to exhibit and sell art. During 2019 – 2020, there were 204 participants in prison and 137 accessing support post-release.

Illicit drugs in prisons

With the suspension of in-person visits, there has been a **significant reduction** in contraband and drugs in the prison system.

Corrections Victoria continues to implement a range of methods to prevent contraband entering Victoria's prisons, including:



Drone and body scanning technology




Use of **drug detection** dogs
