## Courts, VCAT and legal assistance

- To remain open while performing safe essential services the courts and VCAT:
  - o suspended all new civil and criminal jury trials
  - implemented measures to reduce the number of people entering buildings and increased hygiene measures
  - reduced in-court appearances through increasing the capacity for audio-visual conferencing and hearings, and matters dealt with "on the papers"
  - evaluated and prioritised cases to be heard.
- The COVID-19 Omnibus (Emergency Measures) Act 2020 and subordinate Regulations will enable the courts and VCAT to continue to develop their use of technology.
- Government investments are supporting enhanced AVL capability and legal assistance services to hear more matters more quickly.



### Corrections and Youth Justice

- There have been no cases of COVID-19 in Victoria's Corrections or Youth Justice facilities.
- Screening and temperature checks have been introduced for prisoners, staff and professional visitors entering correctional and youth justice facilities.
- A quarantine process for suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases has been put in place as well as a 14 day quarantine period for all prisoners entering custody.
- Primary and mental health services are utilising telehealth services.
- Increased options for prisoners for virtual interaction with family and friends.




### Supporting rental fairness and Victorian businesses to reopen and rebound

- New laws are in place to protect Victorian tenants, landlords and the rental market.
- We've been working with the liquor and gaming industry to implement a range of measures prior to venues reopen.
- We've introduced tax relief measures, including reimbursing businesses that have paid a renewable liquor licence for 2020.
- DJCS has pushed more than \$500 million into the economy by fast-tracking the payment of invoices for local businesses.
- More widely, DJCS and CSV will help to reboot and stimulate the economy through bringing forward important capital investments.



# Workplace safety

- WorkSafe inspectors are visiting workplaces across the State to ensure employers understand their duties and what measures they should put in place.
- Since 31 January, WorkSafe has conducted 1324 inspections specific to COVID-19 risks and have issued 34 compliance notices.
- Over the same period, WorkSafe's Advisory Line has received 1455 calls.
- On workers' compensation, 20 claims related to contracting COVID-19 or the impact of the virus have been accepted to date.
- WorkSafe will continue to work with DHHS to coordinate response efforts to outbreaks affecting Victorian workplaces.
