QUESTION 1 The number of COVID-19 restriction fines by LGA

Answer:

Victoria Police Response:

As at 23 August 2020, Victoria Police has issued 19,324* fines for COVID related offences. In May 2020 the then CCP took on notice to provide infringement data at LGA level based on an assessment that this was operational police data rather than crime statistics information.

Further consultation on this matter with the Crime Statistics Agency has confirmed that infringement information to this level is crime data and therefore, Victoria Police is only able to confirm the aggregate number of infringements.

- Operation Ribbon commenced on 13 April 2020 and progressively rolled out across the state by 20 April 2020.

- In March 2020, Victoria Police observed an increase in firearms Permit to Acquire (PTA) applications received.
 - o In the week beginning 4 March 2020, 1,190 PTAs were received
 - o In the week beginning 18 March 2020, 2,383 PTAs were received (a **100.3% increase** from 4 March 2020)

QUESTION 7	Of fines given out for breaches of restrictions, how many have been	
	paid, cancelled and requested for review?	

Answer:

DJCS Response:

- As at 25 August 2020, 19,866 fines have been issued for breaches of COVID-19 related restrictions.
- Of these fines:
 - 882 fines have been paid in full, and a further 1,688 fines have been entered into a payment arrangement
 - o 1,551 fines have been withdrawn or cancelled
 - 1,726 fines have been requested for review, including 528 requests for the matter to be determined in court.
