Funding in response to COVID-19 impacts

Funding has been announced for the following initiatives to respond to **COVID-19** impacts:





\$103.6 million for Corrections and Youth Justice COVID-19 response



\$43.6 *million* in output

AND

\$2.5 million in asset for Addressing COVID-19 related delays across the justice system



\$20.8 million in output

AND

\$9 million

in asset for the whole of government Building stimulus package

\$10.5 million in output



AND

\$10.6 million asset funding for the upgrade of the temporary community residential facility in Maribyrnong to provide short-term accommodation for men exiting the prison system.



\$17.5 million for additional legal assistance services and ICT investment (state component).

Funding in response to COVID-19 impacts

Funding has been announced for the following initiatives to respond to **COVID-19** impacts:



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\$6.0 million

for Operating the Residential Tenancies Dispute Resolution Scheme and the Residential Tenancy Relief



\$2.5 million to support for Victoria's Aboriginal community



\$2.5 million to support Victoria's multicultural and faith communities



\$2.0 million for Commercial and Residential Tenancies



\$14.9 million for a Bushfire Mental Health package



\$0.4 million for financial counselling to support mental health & wellbeing.

Supporting Justice Sector Response and Recovery

All courts and VCAT have remained open and operational during **COVID-19**. Rapid response to enable continuation of justice services include:





Legislative reforms



Emergency Case Management Protocol



Trial of remote bail justice hearings



Funding for front line legal assistance services in response to COVID-19



Funding to OPA to address critical risk to Victorians with disability during COVID-19



Rapid uplift in technology solutions including AVL

Support for victims of crime during COVID-19



Victims of Crime Helpline and the Victims Assistance Program have continued to support victims of crime



Child Witness Service (CWS) and the Intermediary Pilot Program (IPP) also continue to support child victims, family members and other vulnerable witnesses



Youth Justice and Corrections

Safely easing restrictions across all custodial settings, including:





Youth

- return to face-to-face mental health service provision, criminogenic and psychosocial programs
- face-to-face delivery of education from Term 4
- increased in-person personal and professional visits and temporary leave arrangements available
- Additional supports for Aboriginal children and young people in custody to support them to remain connected to their families, community and culture



Adult

- A Roadmap to COVID Normal in adult prisons has been approved which includes:
 - resumption of personal visits
 - COVID Safe plans with service providers
- Primary and mental health services have continued operating
- Virtual interactions with family and friends have occurred at each prison

Supporting rental fairness and Victorian businesses to reopen and rebound





Temporary laws introduced to protect Victorian tenants, landlords and the rental market

Ongoing relief measures including fee waivers and refunds

Delays in charges and significant gaming machine tax payments help support the liquor and gaming industry during closures

Targeted packages and measures for the hospitality industry, to help licensed venues reopen safely

Workplace Safety during the COVID-19 pandemic





Implementation of additional workplace safety measures to support the **COVID-19 pandemic response**, including:

- extending termination notice periods for long-term injured workers.
- recognising COVID-19 as an immediate risk for the purposes of certain compliance and enforcement actions under the OHS Act
- appointing WorkSafe Inspectors as Authorised Officers
- establishing the High Risk Industries Engagement and Enforcement Operation







DJCS assumed responsibility for COVID-19 related accommodation programs in July and August 2020. Since then: **222** people have entered mandatory quarantine

o returned travellers have tested positive for COVID-19

frontline workers have been supported in the Frontline Worker Accommodation program

Victorians have accessed Emergency Accommodation so they could safely isolate outside their home
