INDUSTRY DEVELOPMENT AND PARTICIPATION

Implemented the Local Jobs First Policy, which covered 335 large and small projects, supporting

- > 6,902 jobs
- > 10,627 opportunities for SMEs
- > 1,528 opportunities for apprentices, trainees and cadets

Set Local content requirements for **34 Strategic Projects** valued at over **\$22.6 billion**, which will deliver an average of **90 per cent local content**.



BUSINESS INVESTMENT AND ENGAGEMENT

Bombardier – establishment of Australian jet maintenance, repair and overhaul facility at Essendon Airport

CSL – facilitated continuation of CSL's **\$500 million** expansion at Broadmeadows

D'Orsogna – opened new **\$66 million** smallgoods manufacturing facility in Melbourne's north with more than **200** employees

Highlights from Global Victoria in 2019-20

Connects Victoria to global opportunities by building the export capability of Victorian businesses and connecting them to global trade opportunities through its international networks.



SUPPORT FOR VICTORIAN FIRMS

Global Victoria delivered a range of government programs, including the:

- > Outbound and inbound trade mission program – delivered 25 missions involving 550 Victorian companies – supported visitation of 593 international delegates from inbound trade missions
- > Access Program provided tailored export support through the 22 VGTI offices
- > Export Skills Program provided businesses with the necessary skills to pursue international opportunities

Through participation in these programs, Global Victoria supported firms to achieve **\$709 million in export sales**

Actual export sales **exceeded** the target by **29 per cent**, due to the extensive pipeline of export sales outcomes driven by businesses attending trade missions in previous years

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Global Victoria supported **42,000** international students through welfare programs and services, including the **Study Melbourne Student Centre**, which saw **250 per cent** increase in demand

Distributed the **\$45 million International Student Emergency Relief Fund**, supporting **12,800** international students as at 30 June 2020

The Inclusion group champions the fair distribution of the economic and social benefits that stem from a strong economy



EMPLOYMENT

Through Jobs Victoria Services, the Inclusion group supported **3,000+ Victorian jobseekers** into work

ABORIGINAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Inclusion has commenced development of the Victorian Aboriginal Employment and Economic Council to advance economic opportunities and prosperity for all Aboriginal Victorians

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DROUGHT

The Agriculture Victoria group responded to drought and dry seasonal conditions in East and Central Gippsland and the far North West of the state

Delivered the **Drought Support package** providing grants and support small business and community resilience

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BUSHFIRE

Supported **960+** farmers impacted by fire across the North East and East Gippsland, including providing immediate animal welfare relief, loss and damage assessment, and recovery services

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RURAL FINANCIAL COUNSELLING

1,900 active clients due to increased demand from farmers across the state

COVID-19

Agriculture Workforce Plan implemented, to address labour force issues due to COVID-19 through job matching, skills development, business adaptation grants and job creation

COVID-19 STIMULUS RESPONSE

Undertaken **comprehensive community consultation**, including leveraging regional partnerships to conduct COVID-19 recovery roundtables



REGIONAL INFRASTRUCTURE

Worked with regional Victorian communities and businesses to **identify projects** to receive funding through the \$2.7 billion Building Works package

Funded **30 regional development and tourism projects**



FACILITATION OF INVESTMENT IN RURAL AND REGIONAL VICTORIA

RDV facilitated \$840 million of new investment in rural and regional Victoria that will create over 1,200 jobs

Supported **148** economic development and service delivery projects

100 per cent participant satisfaction with its program implementation

> E.g. the \$370 million Geelong City Deal, Benalla Splash Park, Ballarat Station Precinct and GovHubs



LATROBE VALLEY AUTHORITY

Continued delivery of the Latrobe Valley Assistance Package

The RRV group facilitates investment and promotes job creation in both established and emerging sectors, including resources, forestry and game



CARBONNET PROJECT

Progressing delivery of the **\$150 million CarbonNet Project.** Offshore drilling at the Pelican site in Bass Strait confirmed its suitability for commercial scale carbon capture and storage



VICTORIAN GAS PROGRAM

Implemented the Victorian Gas Program to improve the understanding of Victoria's onshore conventional gas resources and enable further development of offshore gas and underground gas storage.



HAZELWOOD MINE FIRE INQUIRY

Progressed delivery of key actions, including establishing the new **Mine Land Rehabilitation Authority**



MINERALS RESOURCE STRATEGY

Progressed implementation of this strategy, including the Stavely minerals initiative and launch of the North Central Victorian ground release.

EARTH RESOURCES REGULATIONS

Delivered improvements to the regulation of earth resources in response to the **Getting the Groundwork Right** report

FORESTRY TRANSITION

Released the **\$1.1 million Forestry Business Transition Voucher program** to support timber businesses affected by the **Victorian Forestry Plan**

Highlights from Precincts and Suburbs in 2019-20 *Priority Precincts*

The Precincts and Suburbs group coordinates a whole of government approach to the planning and development of Priority Precincts and Melbourne Suburbs to realise their potential for growth



FISHERMANS BEND

The largest urban renewal precinct in Australia and is expected to accommodate **80,000** jobs and **80,000** residents by 2050

Undertook **significant planning to transform the General Motors Holden** (GMH) site into the Fishermans Bend Innovation Precinct

Secured investments including: \$4.7m on the preliminary business case for transport links between Fishermans Bend and the CBD; \$2m for netball courts and \$2m for redevelopment of the North Port Oval



DOCKLANDS

Supported the design phase of the **\$225 million** redevelopment of Marvel Stadium. This project will help maintain Melbourne's status as the sporting and events capital in Australia

PARKVILLE

Encompasses the Melbourne Biomedical precinct, including over **45** biomedical organisations

Attracted **\$2.8 billion** of investment capital into research and healthcare facilities over the last decade

Secured a new global headquarters for global biotech giant CSL

FOOTSCRAY

Recognised for its role as a gateway to the west, servicing the rapidly growing population

Launched the Footscray Priority Precinct to support the **\$1.5 billion new Footscray Hospital** (2,000 jobs, 200 additional beds)

Highlights from Precincts and Suburbs in 2019-20 *Office of Suburban Development*

The Office for Suburban Development develops and delivers the government vision and policy agenda for Melbourne's suburbs and facilitates coordination across government, business and communities



METROPOLITAN PARTNERSHIPS

The Office for Suburban Development supported Metropolitan Partnerships to:

- > engage Melbournians through six major events with over 500 people attending
- > shape the government response to COVID-19 by advocating for needs at local level
- > support community priorities by investing \$1 million in 10 projects
- > deliver co-designed engagement and youth-led consultation



SUBURBAN REVITALISATION PROGRAM

Supported Hume City Council to deliver the **Broadmeadows Town Hall redevelopment**, with \$18 million generated from Local Government contribution

Facilitated the Frankston town centre Station Street Mall upgrade, leveraging over **\$1.2 million in co-contributions** from the council and private sector

PICK MY PROJECT

Delivered **42 events** in Melbourne through the **\$33 million** community led grants program, supporting education, connectedness, inclusion and disadvantaged people

Highlights from Creative, Sport and Visitor Economy (CSVE) in 2019-20 Creative Industries

Creative Victoria raises the profile, reach and impact of Victoria's creative industries, supports our creative workers and businesses and oversees the state's major creative organisations



RESPONSE TO COVID-19

- **Creative Victoria provided support of \$220 million** (\$49 million announced in the 2019-20 FY) for:
- > 770+ creative workers through the \$4.7 million Sustaining Creative Workers program
- > 170+ music venues and 166 organisations through the Strategic Investment Program and Live Music Support package



UPDATE TO THE CREATIVE STATE STRATEGY

Completed a series of **state-wide public forums** and online consultation. Creative Victoria will use this work to reconsider the strategy in light of COVID-19 impacts

FIRST PEOPLES PARTNERSHIP GROUP

Established the Group with **11 state-wide First Nations representatives** and **delivered the First People Investment Program** to support First Peoples' creative and cultural practice

REGIONAL CREATIVE INDUSTRIES

Creative Victoria supported:

- > 33 regional art galleries and performing arts centres with programming and operational support
- > 22 regional creative organisations for COVID-related support
- > 3 regional touring programs

Highlights from Creative, Sport and Visitor Economy (CSVE) in 2019-20 Sport, Recreation and Racing (SRR)

SRR works collaboratively to improve the health and wellbeing of Victorians and support the development of major sports facilities and high performance pathways



SPORTING INFRASTRUCTURE

SRR delivered the **\$338.2 million Melbourne Park Redevelopment** (stage 2) ahead of time and on budget

Delivered the **St Kilda Australian Football League Women change rooms** and administration facilities as part of the \$13 million Moorabbin Reserve redevelopment (stage 2 works)



2020-21 LOCAL SPORTS INFRASTRUCTURE FUND

SRR supported **100 projects** to develop high quality, accessible community sport and active recreation infrastructure across Victoria

Enabled a total construction value of **\$243** million across the state

COMMUNITY SPORT COVID-19 SHORT-TERM SURVIVAL PACKAGE

SRR delivered **3,834** grants totalling **\$3.8 million** approved and paid to 30 June 2020 to

COMMUNITY SPORT AND RECREATION FORUMS

Delivered **20 forums** across Victoria, including 2020 International Women's Day community sport symposium

RACING

SRR supported **162 racing projects through \$6.9 million** in grants as part of the renewed **Victorian Racing Industry Fund**

Highlights from Creative, Sport and Visitor Economy (CSVE) in 2019-20 Tourism, Events and Visitor Economy (TEVE)

TEVE undertakes research, advises government and industry and provides governance support to entities that market the state, secure events and manage large scale tourist attractions

WORLD CLASS EVENTS

TEVE collaborated with Visit Victoria to continue to **secure and deliver world-class major events** such as:

- > Come From Away
- > ICC T20 Women's World Cup Final
- > UFC243
- > The President's Cup
- > Boomers vs USA Basketball



REGIONAL TOURISM REVIEW

TEVE completed the **Regional Tourism Review** and findings are being used to inform Government support to respond and recover from the impacts of COVID-19

BUSHFIRE AND COVID-19 SUPPORT

TEVE worked closely with Visit Victoria, the Victoria Tourism Industry Council, Regional Tourism Boards and the tourism industry to provide **advice and support**

Delivered targeted support to assist **recovery from bushfires,** including grants for Tourism North East and Destination Gippsland

Includes \$150 million Experience Economy Survival Package

TOURISM INFRASTRUCTURE

TEVE identified tourism projects to benefit from \$382 million through the Building Works Package to upgrade and build new community projects and tourism experiences

Due to prolonged dry seasonal conditions, DJPR provided intensive programs, advice and support to regional communities and business



CLIMATE CHANGE

Climate change and adapting to a carbon-constrained future will require the transformation of Victoria's energy and farming systems



DROUGHT

Due to prolonged dry seasonal conditions, DJPR provided a Drought Support package, including relief payments, and technical support to small businesses and community.
