#### State of the sector

- 83 per cent of Victorians are active at least once a week
- Estimated 580,000 volunteers across the community sport and recreation sector
- Around 10,000 community facilities across Victoria supporting \$7.04 billion in value per annum (economic, health, social)
- Participation in organised sport provides \$1.4 billion in broader benefits

## State of the sector – Impacts of COVID-19

- Estimated \$359 million loss of revenue over 12 months
- Estimated loss of 16,000 jobs across the sector
- Viability of associations, leagues and clubs at risk
- Cancellation of seasons and restriction of activities but activities returning



#### **Our achievements**

- \$40 million Community Sport COVID-19 Short-term Survival Package
- \$178 million Community Sport Infrastructure Stimulus Program, Rounds 1 & 2
- More than \$274 million approved to support 234 community sports infrastructure projects in 2020-21
- First round of the Get Active Kids Voucher Program
- Expanded Sporting Club Grants
- Change Our Game initiatives to level the playing field



### This budget – key initiatives

- Change Our Game: Office for Women in Sport and Recreation
  - \$11.6 million over four years to continue the Office for Women in Sport and Recreation and expand the *Change Our Game* initiatives to level the playing field
- Building inclusive sport and recreation communities \$4 million over four years for the continued delivery of RecLink's ActiVIC program
- Investing in local sports infrastructure
   \$55 million in 2021-22 for grants that deliver new and upgraded community sport and recreation infrastructure
