This year's Budget investment of




builds on our foundations as we recover from the global pandemic:

- expanding workforce attraction and retention activities
- building and upgrading kindergartens
- supporting vulnerable children
- delivering child information sharing reform and the Child Link Register



Investing in the early years – recent Budget investment




Three-Year-Old Kindergarten

\$167.1 million

Over four years to continue the roll-out of quality, funded Three-Year-Old Kindergarten

- This year, programs established in 15 more LGAs, making 21 in total –delivering to around 2,500 children.
- In 2022, children across the state will have access to at least five hours of funded Three-Year-Old Kindergarten.
- By 2029 about **90,000** children will benefit each year.



The staff, buildings and services we need for kinder reform

The \$167.1 million Three-Year-Old Kindergarten funding includes:

\$4.4 million to set up two new 'safe haven' sites in areas of significant disadvantage



\$3.2 million for intensive support packages so children impacted by significant trauma can participate in kinder each year

to expand Koorie pre-school assistants program and continue Koorie Families as First Educators program

\$2.7 million



to continue our early childhood language program – 17 languages in 161 kinders for 6,000 children

Child Link Register – sharing information to keep children safe

\$91.6 million



- To build and maintain the Child Link register, a digital platform for sharing information to promote children's safety and wellbeing.
- The register will provide key information about vulnerability and children's participation in services to enable early risk identification and support.
- This initiative was included in the Child Legislation Amendment (Information Sharing) Act 2018.
