We implemented a range of programs to provide much needed support to seasonal harvests

Seasonal Workforce Program

We have provided \$36 million in assistance to help address seasonal workforce shortages brought on by COVID-19 pandemic

2400	Local job seekers accessing the Seasonal Harvest Sign- on Bonus, with over 900 approved for the second payment
850	Agriculture seasonal workers from the Pacific supported to enter Victoria
13	Locally-led projects to supply COVID-19 safe accommodation through the Seasonal Worker Accommodation Program
2300	Stakeholders engaged with by Seasonal Workforce Coordinators, including over 1000 jobseekers and direct calls to almost 900 business

We celebrated, protected and invested in the innovative potential of the Victorian agricultural sector

Small-scale and Craft Program

\$4.1 million worth of grants to help 165 smallscale and craft agribusinesses to expand and diversify

Native foods and botanical

\$2 million in Djakitjuk Djanga grants to 13 recipients to support Aboriginal leadership and participation in Victoria's native food and botanicals industry

On-farm IoT trial

\$6.4 million in grants to 354 farmers to support adoption of internet-enabled technologies

Agrilinks

\$20 million to support rural, regional and interface councils to upgrade local road linkages that support the agri-food sector

SmartFarms

Supported continued agricultural research and innovation through the opening of new SmartFarms in Tatura, Ellinbank and Mildura

Biosecurity

Responded to biosecurity challenges, including achieving freedom from Avian Influenza, and addressing Khapra Beetle and AVG outbreaks



We invested in the forestry and game industries to prepare them for future growth

Forestry

- \$11.2 million to support timber salvage harvesting operations
- \$2 million was allocated to establish the Gippsland Centre of the National Institute for Forest Products Innovation - First round of proposals closed 14 May 2021
- Released the \$4 million Local Development Strategy grants program.
 Work on the Orbost local development strategy is underway
- Four business transition plans are complete,19 are in progress and three applications are being processed under the \$1.1 million Forestry Business Transition Voucher Program

Forestry (Cont.)

- 9 applications received under the first round of the Timber Innovation Grants Program
- \$110 million Gippsland Plantations Investment Program was released to market and 500 hectares of crown land plantings
- Victorian Forestry Plan engagement 960 community and stakeholder interactions

Game

- Launched the Traditional Owner Game Management Strategy
- Progressed the Government's commitment to move toward adaptive harvest management
- Commenced development of the second Sustainable Hunting Action Plan (SHAP 2)

We are helping farmers assure the quality of their produce globally through modern 'product to plate' traceability systems

Transforming traceability systems - \$11.7 million

We are working with to enhance Victoria's reputation for safe and high-quality food and fibre products

Funding will support the agri-food sector to design, test and adopt modern traceability technologies and systems, including:
