Trade is vital to the Victorian economy, but closed borders and freight disruptions continue to have a significant impact on exporters

## But the COVID-19 pandemic has had a significant impact on exporters including severe disruptions to freight and global supply chains

- 3.6% decline in Victorian exports in 2019-20 compared to previous year
- Education exports down \$3.2 billion in 2020
- Air freight prices 1.5 3.5x pre-COVID levels
- But some sectors have remained resilient, including beef, cosmetics and dairy

#### **Our achievements**

- Export Recovery Package (2020-21 Budget)
  - Global Gateway: Over 180 high performing exporters have received grants for access to professional services to help them stabilise and adapt their export strategies
  - Virtual Trade Missions: 28 missions delivered this financial year
  - eCommerce program to support Victorian companies to capture new opportunities, including Export Skills Program
  - Advocacy to ensure Victorian exporters are well served through the Commonwealth's International Freight Assistance Mechanism (IFAM) – launched in April 2020 and extended to September 2021

#### **Our achievements**

- Supporting International Education (2020-21 Budget)
  - \$45 million International Student Emergency Relief Fund (2019-20 and 2020-21) – supported over 33,400 students with payments up to \$1,100 and \$2 million in food relief
  - \$33.4 million for the International Education Short-Term Recovery Plan
  - \$350 million to support universities through the Victorian Higher Education State Investment Fund

### This budget – key initiatives

- The 2021-22 Budget includes \$50.9 million over four years to support Victoria's international education sector to recover and return to growth.
- Includes funding for:
  - expanded Global Education Network and Study Melbourne Hubs in strategic offshore markets
  - Study Melbourne brand destination marketing activity
  - Study Melbourne Student Centre, providing emergency and welfare support services to international students
  - Study Melbourne Inclusion Program and Study Melbourne Empowered Program to improve the international student experience and build sector capacity
  - International Education Advisory Council providing strategic advice to Government on sector stabilisation and recovery

## This budget – key initiatives

- The 2021-22 Budget provides \$5 million for Trade Facilitation including:
  - Trade Mission Program continuation of virtual trade missions and one on one export facilitation support.
  - A local campaign and targeted international export campaigns
- The 2021-22 Budget also includes \$4.2 million over 4 years to support the Victorian Government Trade and Investment Network, including to:
  - Continue our operations and presence in **Tel Aviv** office and extend staffing resources to maintain the continued delivery of the **India Strategy**
- \$1.2 million for new investment professionals in strategic markets
