State of the portfolio

Business Precincts play a key role in Victoria's economic future by stimulating the local economy, providing more jobs, boosting investment and strengthening social connection.

There are four Business Precincts:

- ▶ Fishermans Bend
- Docklands
- ▶ Parkville
- ► Footscray

Our achievements – Fishermans Bend

Fishermans Bend is the largest urban renewal precinct in Australia, with 80,000 anticipated jobs by 2050. It will become a centre for innovation, advanced manufacturing, engineering and design.

- ▶ Purchase of the former General Motors Holden (GMH) site for development of the Fishermans Bend Innovation Precinct. Stage One implementation is about to start.
- ► Fishermans Bend Secondary School (under construction, due to open 2022) and South Melbourne Primary School (delivered)

► Planning for deliver of a Community Hospital and three new primary schools

Our achievements – Docklands

Development of Docklands is more than 60 per cent complete, with more than 1,000,000m² commercial floor space and more than 10,000 apartments.

- ► 13,000 residents and 73,000 people working in the precinct
- ► More than \$14.6 billion in private investment
- ► More than \$900 million in public infrastructure to date

- ► \$225 million towards the redevelopment of Marvel Stadium to bring world-class sporting and entertainment events
- ► \$46 million investment to deliver Docklands Studios Sound Stage 6
- An EOI process to deliver the Docklands Media Precinct

Our achievements – Parkville

Parkville is the leading biomedical cluster in Asia Pacific, playing a critical role in Australia's response to COVID-19. There are almost 50,000 jobs based in the precinct and it attracts about one third of Australia's competitive biomedical research funding.

- ➤ \$2.8 billion of investment capital into research and healthcare facilities over the last decade
- ➤ \$4.6 million to support the commercialisation of Victoria's biomedical research into local jobs and industry
- ➤ \$123.8 million to implement a modern electronic medical records system for the Parkville precinct

- ➤ \$155 million in the 2020-21 Budget for the establishment of the Australian Institute of Infectious Disease with a further a commitment of up to \$245 million
- Australia's largest biotech company, CSL, to locate its global headquarters in the precinct
- Establishment of the Illumina University of Melbourne Genomics Hub
- Construction well underway on the new Parkville Station as part of the Metro Tunnel

Our achievements – Footscray

Footscray is of significant strategic importance to Melbourne's west, servicing the rapidly growing population and providing new and diversified economic opportunities.

- ► A new \$1.5 billion Footscray Hospital (2,000 jobs and 200 additional beds). Site works have commenced
- ▶ \$65 million Footscray Learning Precinct program
- ▶ Josephs Road tower apartment development has commenced (new anticipated community of 5,000)

- ➤ \$6.7 billion West Gate Tunnel project
- ➤ \$36.6 million Whitten Oval upgrade and development
- Metro Tunnel connecting Cranbourne/ Pakenham to Airport via Melbourne Airport Rail

This budget – key initiatives

- ► Fishermans Bend Innovation Precinct at the former General Motors Holden site \$179.4 million
- **▶ Digital Infrastructure Upgrade: Cremorne -** \$1 million

Precinct initiatives through other portfolios'

- ► Central Pier Redevelopment Business Case \$3 million
- ► Improving Transport Connections to Fishermans Bend \$15 million
