GC2018 Budget

- Please see a link to the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games Post Games Report (2019) which provides a detailed analysis of the Games and related projects budgets, and concludes:
 - "With good planning, prudent financial management, solid revenue and infrastructure delivered ahead of the Games, GC2018 was delivered well within the total forecast budget" (page 6) and "The Games was projected to cost the Queensland Government \$1.507 billion. The actual total net cost to the Queensland Government from the Games budget was \$1.340 billion (89 per cent of the total budget forecast)" (page 228).
- Please see a link to the Auditor General's report from 2014 (4 years out from the event) which highlighted a lack of sophistication in Games preparation budgets and cautioned against the potential for cost overruns as a result.
