Switching on the Metro Tunnel Project

The 2024/25 Budget invests

 \$233 million to complete the integration of the new tunnel into Victoria's transport network and prepare the staff, systems and customer information for services to start.

2023/24 was a year of milestones

- Completion of Arden and Parkville stations
- First test trains through tunnel
- Testing of high-capacity signalling

The Metro Tunnel is on track to open in 2025

- Further testing and integration and trial operations
- Linking the Sunbury, Cranbourne and Pakenham lines through five new stations.



Opening the West Gate Tunnel to slash travel times and take trucks off roads

2023/24 was a milestone year:

- Tunnelling completed
- Road deck laid in tunnel
- Two outbound lanes and one inbound lane added on West Gate Freeway

The West Gate Tunnel will open in 2025:

- Widening West Gate Freeway from eight lanes to
 12
- Construction of tunnel entries and exits
- Opening of new shared user paths
- Further activity focusing on taking trucks off local roads



Removing 110 dangerous and congested level crossings by 2030

77 level crossings are gone for good, including throughout 2023 and 2024:

Mt Derrimut Rd, Deer Park • Union Rd, Surrey Hills • Mont Albert Rd, Mont Albert • Glen Huntly Rd, Glen Huntly • Neerim Rd, Glen Huntly • Camms Road, Cranbourne • Webb Street, Narre Warren

10 are being removed in 2024, including:

Main Street, McGregor Rd, Racecourse Rd, Pakenham • Dublin Rd, Ringwood • Brunt Rd, Beaconsfield • Coolstore Rd, Croydon • Warrigal Rd, Parkdale, Parkers Rd, Parkdale • Keon Pde, Reservoir

with Lilydale to be the first line on the network to be level crossing free.

North East Link, the missing link in Melbourne's freeway network

NEL will take 15,000 trucks off local roads

- 6.5km road tunnels
- 5,000 workers on the project
- \$5 billion Commonwealth investment

2023/24 saw major milestones:

- Bulleen Park and Ride completed
- Over a quarter of tunnel's internal concrete segments manufactured
- TBM retrieval box completed

2024/25 will see the launch of TBMs
