STANDING ORDER OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

LAPSED BILLS RESTORATION.

When a motion to bring in any Bill is agreed to, if such Bill bears a certificate from the Clerk of this House that it is identical with a Bill as last agreed to by the House, which passed its second reading in the previous Session of the same Parliament, but was not finally disposed of by both Houses when the Session closed, then a motion may be made that such Bill be advanced to the stage it had reached in the Legislative Council in the former Session or to any earlier stage. If such motion be agreed to, the Bill shall thereupon be passed, without amendment or debate, through each of the stages authorized by the motion agreed to by the House, and thereafter shall be proceeded with and dealt with in the same manner as other Bills.

[To remain in force until the end of this present Parliament.]
